




Nocturnal (adjective)	Being active at night. Some animals sleep more during the day and are more awake at night
Confidential (adjective)	Spoken in secret or private. A confidential informant is someone who's identity is only known to the person that they're giving secret information to; a secret helper
Skittering (verb)	To run over a surface rapidly
Camouflage (noun or verb)	Natural colors or clothing to help the wearer blend in to their surroundings
Invasive (adjective)	Growing and thriving in an area that a plant or animal is not native to, often to the disadvantage of native plants or animals
Crossroads (noun)	A place where two or more roads or trails meet
Crayfish (noun)	A small freshwater crustacean; kind of like a small lobster that lives in streams, rivers, lakes and swamps
Crepuscular (adjective)	Being active at sunrise and sunset. Some animals rest during the day and at night, but are awake and active when the sun is rising or setting
Hasten (verb)	To make something go faster
Autograph (noun, adjective or verb)	Growing and thriving in an area that a plant or animal is not native to, often to the disadvantage of native plants or animals
Soprano (noun or adjective)	A voice or instrument that has the highest notes in a song
Sonic (noun or adjective)	Something that is related to sound
Fisticuffs (noun)	A fight using only hands or fists
Montage (noun)	In movies and TV: a series of short shots edited together to show a larger story
Sidekick (noun)	In superhero stories, an assistant or helper; not the main character
