Primary Responsibilities:

- Assist and provide support to Lead Teaching Artists in the classroom by working with campers in small groups or one-on-one. Classes range in discipline and include story-telling, music, devising, theatre arts, dance, craft, design, & puppet making
- Prepare and reset classrooms for programming
- Assist with transitions and lunch time
- Occasionally lead group games during class time or transitions
- Possibility to assist with tech, props, costumes, and final Friday shows

We are seeking candidates who are rising 8th-12th graders that have a passion for working with children and their families. The hired candidate(s) will be trained and assisted by teachers and staff members at Chicago Children's Theatre who are experienced with our curriculum and programs.
