Job Summary

Chicago Children's Theatre residencies provide high quality, in-school and after-school theatre arts education and enrichment opportunities that support students in their creative process through devising, while developing their social and critical thinking skills. Our residency programs across Chicago range from Early Childhood Education to K-5th. Teaching Artists will implement lesson plans based on the CCT curriculum and will work with our partner schools and their students in-person.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Adhere to all classroom guidelines, safety, and emergency procedures as outlined by CCT.
- Arrive at residency location punctually and fully prepared.
- Attend teaching artist training and lesson planning meetings.
- Document program successes and challenges and share with CCT.
- Document and report any and all incidents to CCT staff immediately after the incident.
- Ensure that CCT's mission, values, guidelines, policies and procedures are implemented and maintained when working with peers, partnering schools and students.
- Execute goals, expectations, and requirements laid out in your schedule and lessons.
- Manage and track program activities such as class attendance, lesson plans, and student assessments in collaboration with the School Partnerships Manager.
- Plan and execute age-appropriate theatre based lesson plans.
- Provide excellent classroom management and structure for supporting students' development.

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Responsibilities cont.

- Support students in learning and engaging in activities that include a diverse and inclusive range of storytelling and concepts.
- Plan and establish a safe learning environment for all participants.
- Work collaboratively with the CCT staff through the duration of the program(s) by meeting deadlines, reporting any concerns including lessons, goals, attendance, materials, and facility issues.

- A passion for working with children and supporting their interest in the arts as well as their overall development.
- An abundant curiosity to learn and a willingness to assist.
- Ability to use theatre techniques and exercises to help students develop empathy and broaden their understanding of each other and the world around them, empowering them with valuable tools that can be applied throughout their lives.
- Ability to work independently and with a wide range of internal & external personalities in a professional & congenial manner.
- Ability to pass a background check in accordance with state and federal laws.
- Consistent attendance at planning meetings and required trainings.
- A dedication to access, inclusion, and anti-racism.
- Daytime availability, Monday-Friday to teach our year-round residency programs.
- Extensive experience working directly with students and teachers.
- Excellent communication, problem solving and organizational skills.
- Enthusiasm for working in a collaborative artistic environment with artists, educators, and children.
- Ideal candidates will have prior experience in teaching within the arts education field for programs with grades K-5th and/or Early Childhood Education.
- Proficiency with Microsoft Office and Google Suite.
- Spanish language proficiency (preferred, not required).
- Ability to travel to program sites in Chicago schools and bring program supplies to sites as needed.

Working Environment:

Residencies can take place in a traditional or conventional classroom space. Position may include occasional lifting (up to 50 lbs individually), carrying, pushing &/or pulling, climbing & balancing, stooping, kneeling, crouching &/or crawling.
