#### A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

I have an older brother who treated me very similar to the way Big Brother treats Carmela in the play. He didn't like taking me places and would threaten to leave me if I walked too slow. If I was lucky, he would tell jokes or stories about our parents. This was one of the reasons I chose to adapt Carmela Full of Wishes for the stage. I felt connected to Carmela and her big brother.

Along with this connection, there were two other reasons I wanted to adapt this story. One being that I believe it is important for my son to see stories about strong girls, especially those with brown skin. I want him to know that stories about fierce Latinas with awesome imaginations are just as important as the superhero stories he loves.

I also knew that this project would be a great opportunity to develop with my wife. This is our fifteenth time working together. For each one, our goal has been the same. To tell stories about the Latinx community. A community whose stories are not often told on the American stage but should.

I will always be grateful for Chicago Children's Theatre for first introducing me to Matt de la Peña's and Christian Robinson's beautiful picture book. It happened in early 2020 as the world was shutting down. During this unpredictable and scary time, adapting this book gave me something to look forward to.

We hope you enjoy this show as much as we enjoyed creating it.

No matter where you are from or how you identify, I have no doubts you will also find a connection with Carmela and her Big Brother.

We all have wishes and we all have hopes they will all come true.

She was named "Tastemaker" by Time Out Chicago Kids, and has three times been highlighted in New City's "Players" list of "People Who Really Perform for Chicago." Jacqueline is originally from Houston, Texas, and is a graduate of New York University. Her daughter, Shiri Nicole, attends the University of Chicago.



Alvaro Saar Rios (he/him, Adaptor) is a Texican playwright living in Chicago. His plays have been performed in New York City, Mexico City, Hawaii, Chicago, St. Louis, Milwaukee and all over Texas. He has received playwriting commissions from various organizations, including Kennedy Center, Chicago Children's Theatre, First Stage, Houston Grand Opera, Honolulu Theatre for Youth, Michigan's Purple Rose Theatre Company, The Zoological Society of Milwaukee and Omaha's Rose Theater. His award-winning play *Luchadora*! is published by Dramatic Publishing Inc. Other plays include *On The* 

Wings of a Mariposa, The History of Mexicans in 10 Minutes, The Day the Music Came Back and Unmuted, a virtual musical he co-created with composer Deborah Wicks La Puma. Alvaro is a Resident Playwright at Chicago Dramatists and Playwright-In-Residence at Milwaukee's First Stage. A proud veteran of the US Army, Saar Rios used to drive MIA1 tanks. Alvaro holds an MFA in Writing for the Stage and Screen from Northwestern University and teaches playwriting at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.



Matt de la Peña (he/him, Author of the book on which the play is based) is the New York Times Bestselling, Newbery Medal-winning author of seven young adult novels (including *Mexican WhiteBoy, We Were Here,* and *Superman: Dawnbreaker*) and six picture books (including *Milo Imagines the World* and *Last Stop on Market Street*). In 2016 he was awarded the NCTE Intellectual Freedom Award. Matt received his MFA in creative writing from San Diego State University and his BA from the University of the Pacific where he attended school on a full basketball scholarship. In 2019 Matt was

given an honorary doctorate from UOP. de la Peña currently lives in Southern California. He teaches creative writing and visits schools and colleges throughout the country.



**Christian Robinson** (he/him, Illustrator of the book on which the play is based) was born in Hollywood, California. He grew up in a small one-bedroom apartment with his brother, two cousins, aunt, and grandmother. Drawing became a way to make space for himself and to create the kind of world he wanted to see. He studied animation at the California Institute of the Arts and would later work with the Sesame Workshop and Pixar Animation Studios before becoming an illustrator of books for children. His books include *Gaston and Antoinette*, written by Kelly DiPucchio, and the

#1 New York Times bestseller *Last Stop on Market Street*, written by Matt de la Peña, which was awarded a Caldecott Honor, a Coretta Scott King Illustrator Honor, and the Newbery Medal. 
