WHERE WE OVERLAP WHAT DO YOU HAVE IN COMMON WITH CARMELA?

If the actor playing Carmela is adventurous too, she could use her own adventurousness on stage to help tell the story. It's also helpful to remember that even different people facing different circumstances often have some things in common.
