Charlie Malave (Musician) aka Charlie Universe aka Charlie Wednesday aka Charlie Business, is a musician, multi-instrumentalist, performing artist, and video maker whose body of work has produced an array of unique instruments, compositions, music videos, and theatrical productions. He is the guitarist and current Artistic Director for Mucca Pazza (a performance-art, marching band/rock band/orchestra), and half of the Creative Weirdo team which produces Adventure Sandwich (a cartoon-ish cardboard-based family show). As Charlie Wednesday, he is the bandleader and cohost of Mr. and Mrs. Wednesday-Night (a mostly-improvised fever dream of music and variety).



Lily Emerson (Puppeteer) is a multifaceted performer, producer, collaborator, and all-around creative weirdo. She recently performed at the Chicago Children's Theatre with Manual Cinema's Leonardo!, and has been honored to work with both CCT and the Chicago Symphony Orchestra as a part of the Once Upon a Symphony program. Lily is the co-creator of Adventure Sandwich, a Chicago-based family-friendly performance collective. Previously, she served as the Artistic Director of Opera-Matic NFP and as founder of Lucid Street Theatre. Lily has performed throughout the US, the UK, Belarus, the Czech Republic, and France, and has been

recognized with various awards and residencies, including Chicago's Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events Individual Artists Program, the Lisa Dershin LinkUP Residency, the Peggy Notebaert Nature Museum's Artist in Residence, and the Chicago Digital Media Production Fund. CREATIVE TEAM



Will Bishop (Director, Co-Creator) is so pleased to return to this beautiful production for another year! As Chicago Children's Theatre's Director of Production, he has overseen the production of CCT's shows since 2016. He is proud that this show has played as CCT's holiday tradition for the past eight years, has toured to dozens of schools and libraries around Chicago, played in the Ninth Annual China Children's Theatre Festival, in Beijing and Jinan, and has been adapted into a hybrid film/live drive-in movie experience during the pandemic. He has also designed scenery, props,

costumes and/or puppets for Frederick (with Michael Shannon), Doll Face Has a Party! (with Brian Selznick), The Relocation of Nokwsi, The Very Hungry Caterpillar Show (2019 and 2023), The World Inside Me (Chicago, Miami, and New Victory Theatre, NYC), X Marks the Spot! (Chicago and Sarasota FL), My Wonderful Birthday Suit, Red Kite Green Mountain (Flynn Center, Burlington VT) and numerous collaborations with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.. He recently started teaching technical theatre at University of Illinois - Chicago. When not making theatre, he's probably playing tabletop RPGs, making and eating vegan food, or hanging out with his own animal friends - Fawkes the Chihuahua and Goblin the Cat.



Grace Needlman (Co-creator, Puppet Designer and Builder) is a cultural worker and maker preoccupied with questions of collective imagination and agency. Grace's puppet designs have appeared in theatrical productions across Chicago. As a company member at Rough House and Chicago Puppet Lab Coordinator, Grace works to create equitable pathways for puppeteers in Chicago. Grace graduated with a BA in fine art from Yale University and an MA in Contemporary Art Theory from Goldsmiths University of London.



Kay Kron (Co-creator) is a theatre maker and teaching artist with a special place in her heart for puppets. She was a performer in CCT's annual show The Beatrix Potter Holiday Tea Party and toured across Chicago and in 2019, to China. Previous to CCT, she spent several years as a professional actor with credits at The House, Lookingglass, Haven, First Floor, Caffeine, Rough House, and Redmoon. Her written work includes The Stranger and The Shadow (co-production Rough House and Adventure Stage

Chicago); Constance and the Perpetual Motion Machine (co-author; Rough House); Dis-Replacement, Winter Pageant, and Devil's Cabaret (various lyrics, narration, and dialog, Redmoon); and a handful of poetry chap books. She holds a BFA in Acting and a Masters of Nonprofit Management from DePaul University.

Chicagoland, he has designed over sixty theatrical productions and has two Jeff Award nominations for his sound design.



Chas Mathieu (he/him, Scenic Supervisor) Is excited to be back at Chicago Children's Theatre this season. Chas is also a scenic designer and artist working in the city of Chicago. In his free time, he enjoys exploring the city and painting with watercolors.



Jacqueline Russell (Co-Founder and Artistic Director, Chicago Children's Theatre) served as the Executive Director of Lookingglass Theatre Company, during which time she led the company's build and move into Lookingglass' current performance space in the Water Tower Water Works. Before joining Lookingglass, she spent five years as creator of Children's Programs at Old Town School of Folk Music. In addition to leading CCT's new play development, main stage, and education programs, Russell is the creator of the Red Kite Project, a CCT program dedicated to bringing theatre into

the lives of children with special needs. In 2010, she was appointed by the U.S. State Department to serve as Cultural Envoy to Canada, was honored with the 2013 "Hero of the Year Award" from the Chicago chapter of Autism Speaks, and was recently honored as one of 20 women who have shaped arts and culture in Chicago on the Kerry James Marshall mural at the Chicago Culture Center. She was named "Tastemaker" by Time Out Chicago Kids, and is in the New City's "Players Hall of Fame" of "People Who Really Perform for Chicago." Jacqueline is originally from Houston, Texas, and is a graduate of New York University. She has a grown up daughter, Shiri, a turtle named Leonard, two cats— Nucci Noodles and Lottie— and her dog, Lulu.

CHICAGO CHILDREN'S THEATRE

Chicago Children's Theatre was founded in 2005 with a big idea: Chicago is the greatest theater city in the world, and it deserves a great children's theater. Today, Chicago Children's Theatre is the city's largest professional theater company devoted exclusively to children and families, with emphasis on access and inclusion.

Led by Artistic Director Jacqueline Russell and Co-Founder Todd Leland, Chicago Children's Theatre has built its national reputation on new work, producing 22 world premieres and over 1,000,000 community members served.

In January 2017, the company celebrated the opening of its new, permanent home located in a former police station at 100 S. Racine Avenue in Chicago's West Loop community.

CCT provides thousands of free and reduced-price tickets to under-resourced schools each season in partnership with Chicago Public Schools. CCT also continues to grow its education programs emphasizing student authorship, youth empowerment, and community leadership.

In 2019, Chicago Children's Theatre won the National TYA Artistic Innovation Award from Theatre for Young Audiences/USA. In addition, Chicago Children's Theatre has garnered seven NEA Art Works grants, and in 2017, became the first theater for young audiences in the U.S. to win a National Theatre Award from the American Theatre Wing, creators of the Tony Awards.

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Beatrix Potter Fun Facts & Discussion Topics

Beatrix Potter based her characters on animals she kept as pets. The "real" Peter was a rabbit named Peter Piper. Beatrix Potter loved her pet rabbit Peter, and he went everywhere with her for nine years. She even took Peter for walks on a leash! In her schoolroom at home she had rabbits, hedgehogs, frogs, mice, and even a bat! **What's your favorite animal?**

Beatrix Potter originally wrote "The Tale of Peter Rabbit" as an illustrated letter to her friend's son Noel, who was ill at the time, and needed some cheering up! It had lots of pictures of rabbits. **What's your favorite thing to draw?**

Beatrix Potter published her first book, "The Tale of Peter Rabbit," all on her own when she was 36 years old. **What's your favorite book?**

Beatrix Potter was an artist and a scientist, drawing and studying the world around her. She wrote a scientific paper on fungi (mushrooms), proposing her own theory on how they reproduce, which was presented on her behalf at the Linnean Society, which at the time did not allow women at their meetings. Mushrooms are delicious. **What's your favorite food?**

In 1903, Potter designed and created the very first Peter Rabbit doll. She sewed the doll using cotton fabric and used brush bristles for whiskers. **Do** you like to make things?

In the show you are about to see, Charlie Malaver, plays 3 instruments. **Do** you play an instrument? If not, what would you like to play?

When Beatrix Potter was a little girl, games like jump rope, marbles, yo-yos, follow the leader, and tug of war were popular. **Do you have a favorite** game or sport you like to play?

Beatrix Potter was an award-winning sheep farmer and in 1943 was the first woman elected President of the Herdwick Sheep Breeders' Association. A sheep could be a nice pet. **What kind of pet would you like if you could have any creature, real or imaginary?**
