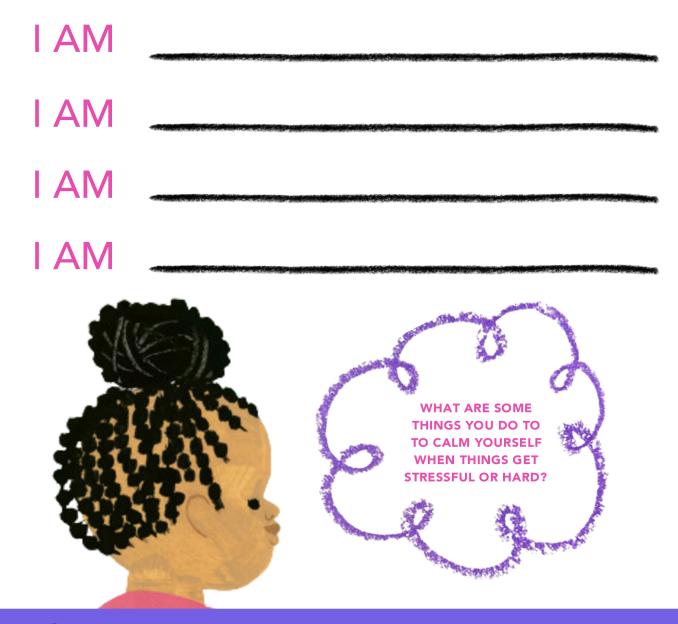

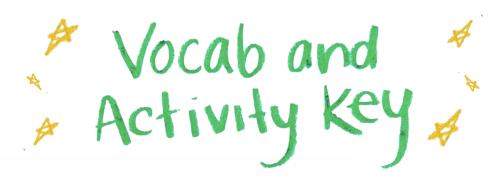

AFFIRMATIONS (Emotional support and/or encouragement.)

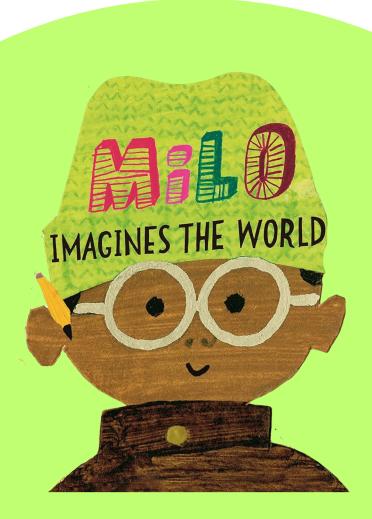
TEPID (Showing little enthusiasm.)
